



## Edward P. HUMMEL

December 27, 1927 - March 26, 2019

Edward P. Hummel died peacefully at age 91 on March 26, 2019, at Delmar Gardens on the Green in Chesterfield, Mo. From February 1946 to August 1947, Edward served in the United States Army and achieved the rank of Sergeant. His Army specialty was radar, and he served as radar fundamentals course instructor in Boca Raton, Fla. He worked at Keeler-Morris Printing Co. for 45 years, ending his career in 1975 as superintendent, and he taught for many years at the Graphic Arts Institute in Shrewsbury.

Edward had a passion for Ford vehicles, photography, golf, woodworking, and Star Trek. He loved the outdoors and lived on 5 acres in St. Charles County with his wife for 40 years.

Edward was the beloved husband for nearly 71 years of Shirley K. Hummel, having met when they were 13 years old. He was preceded in death by his brother, Jerome Hummel. Edward is survived by his daughter, Christine Hummel; brother, Leonard Hummel; and sisters, Annette Heidenreich and Sharon Board.
